# Pre-operative Assessment – Cataract Day Surgery



You will have your eye sight tested -

One eye will be covered.

Say what you can see on the screen.

The other eye will be tested too.



Your blood pressure will be recorded.

A cuff is put on your arm.

The cuff fills with air. It feels tight on your arm.

The machine beeps when it has finished.

Your blood sugar levels may be checked.

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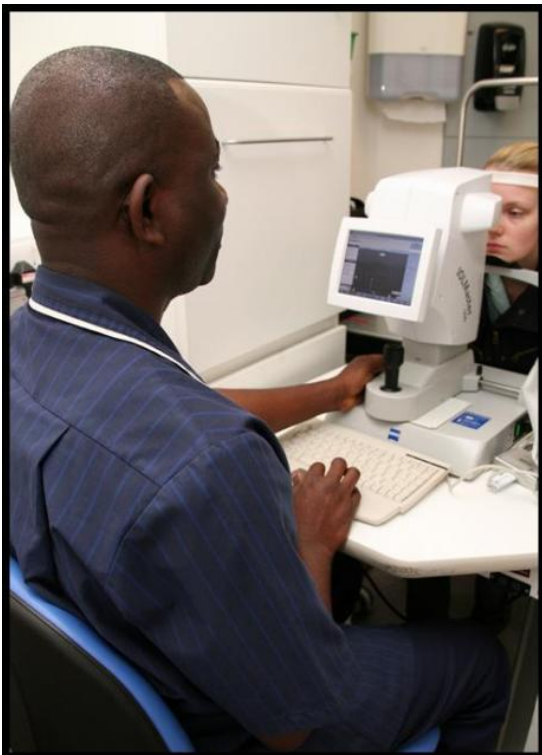


A nurse will look closely at your eyes -

The nurse will show you where to rest your head.

The machine comes very close to your eye.

The nurse will put some drops in your eyes. It might sting.



Your eyes will be measured with a computer.

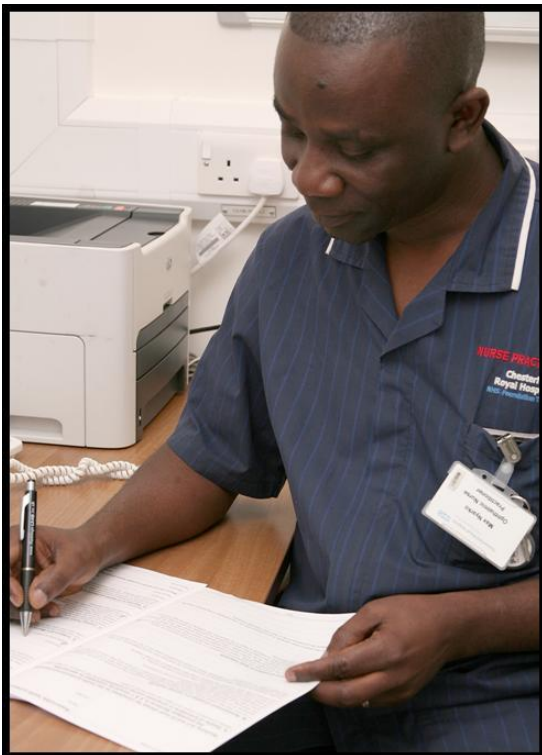
This is done to work out the correct lens size for your operation.

You will be asked to look at the different coloured lights.

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The doctor will see you and look closely at your eyes again.



Staff will talk to you about the operation.

You will be asked to sign a consent form if you agree to have the operation.

They will give you some information all about the operation.
