- Derbyshire Coalition for Inclusive Living (DCIL).

What does the group do?

- DCIL is a disabled people's membership organisation, which is involved in campaigning and provides a range of services.
- Information and advice service – provides information on a range of issues to disabled people, their carers and people who work with them. We provide welfare benefits advice to disabled people. For example, we can give information on education, employment, and housing and disabled people's rights.
- Direct payment support service – offers advice, support and information to disabled people who are receiving direct payments or are considering applying for direct payments.
- Payroll service – works with disabled people who employ personal assistants and provides them with payroll documentation and advice on payroll issues. There is a charge for this service.
- Peer Counselling Service – provides counselling to disabled people or family members on issues that are affecting their lives.
- We provide training to disabled people including personal development training and using IT and to organisations around disability related issues.
- Disabled People's mentoring project – based at our Shirebrook office, which covers the Districts of Bolsover, Chesterfield and North East Derbyshire.
- Youth Volunteering Project – which works with young people who wish to volunteer with us or with community organisations.
- We assist disabled people with finding suitable voluntary work with community organisations and offer supported volunteering opportunities to disabled within our organisation.
